I conducted research and wrote up the findings toward the goal of academic publication. In particular, I have produced a book proposal, discussed it with relevant scholars to receive constructive feedback in preparation for submission to a publisher, and made progress on the book manuscript draft. Additionally, I have worked on a version of the material for publication in an academic article as a potential stepping-stone toward accomplishing the larger book project. (No students were involved in this project.)

2. What were the major findings? If there are no findings or completed work at this time, what did you learn from carrying out this project that could be applicable to future scholarly works?

The academic article was submitted to the *Journal of Cold War Studies*, a premier A-list journal in the field chosen as a best outlet for my work that utilizes archival material. The submission was reviewed through a double-blind academic review process and I have recently received a "Revise & Resubmit" decision. One of the major findings is that the work is valued in the field and I am encouraged to pursue publication. I will use this experience toward finalizing the article as well as advancing the book project.

I plan on publication in an academic journal and eventually with a book publisher. As opportunities arise, I would also like to present my work. In terms of a timeline, I plan to wrap up the article revision over the summer of 2016 and continue to work on the book during my sabbatical in the fall of 2016. Additionally, I continue to incorporate relevant aspects of my research into my teaching as appropriate. This project's topics are covered by several of my classes, which tend to be of great interest to our students.



4. What future scholarly works will be related to this project?

In addition to the aforementioned scholarly outputs, I would also like to disseminate my findings through a public policy oriented and/or practitioner venue such as by publishing an article in a policy-relevant journal or presenting the material to a broader audience.

5. Is there external funding that you would like to pursue with the Office of Sponsored Programs?

Yes, I have several follow-on academic projects underway and would like to seek further research funding and course release to facilitate their timely completion.
