

Art History and Visual Studies
Suggested Course Sequence
based on 2017-2018 catalog requirements

1. Take the required 2000-level survey courses first—the sooner, the better:

ART 2602 Western Tradition I: Ancient and Medieval Art
ART 2603 Western Tradition II: Art since the Renaissance
2. Take your required Studio Art courses early – preferably during the freshman or sophomore year (choose 2):

ART 1102 Drawing Studio
ART 1205 Design Studio Color
ART 2302 Painting Studio
ART 2421 Printmaking Studio
3. Take your required 3000-level courses as a sophomore, junior, or, if necessary, senior.
ART 3605 Modern Art
ART 3606 Cross-Cultural Encounters
ART 3608 Issues in Contemporary Art
ART 3611 Reading Images
4. Take your required language courses as a sophomore, junior, or, if necessary, senior. (10 credits beyond competency – talk to your advisor about the best language fit for you.)
5. Take your “concentration area” courses as a junior or senior. (10 credits, 5 Upper Division. Talk to your advisor about how to select courses that best match your interests.)
6. Wait until your senior year to take ART 4898 Art History Capstone.

You can substitute certain Study Abroad courses for the required courses listed above. Talk to your advisor for more information.
